

Decorative Double Keychain Tutorial



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Supplies Needed

*Regular embroidery supplies, stabilizer, thread, scissors etc. (Note: I like cutaway stabilizer for most ITH projects unless otherwise indicated. I find that it provides more stability to the finished product.

*Vinyl or leather for the front

*I used oly fun for the back, but you could also use a thin vinyl like chalkboard vinyl or something that doesn't fray. Cork is also very thin and works wonderfully!

*Hole punch

*1 long barrel rivet, Chicago screw or size 20 Kam snap

*Key chain hardware - I used a split ring and a swivel lobster clip.

***My supplies are listed below.**

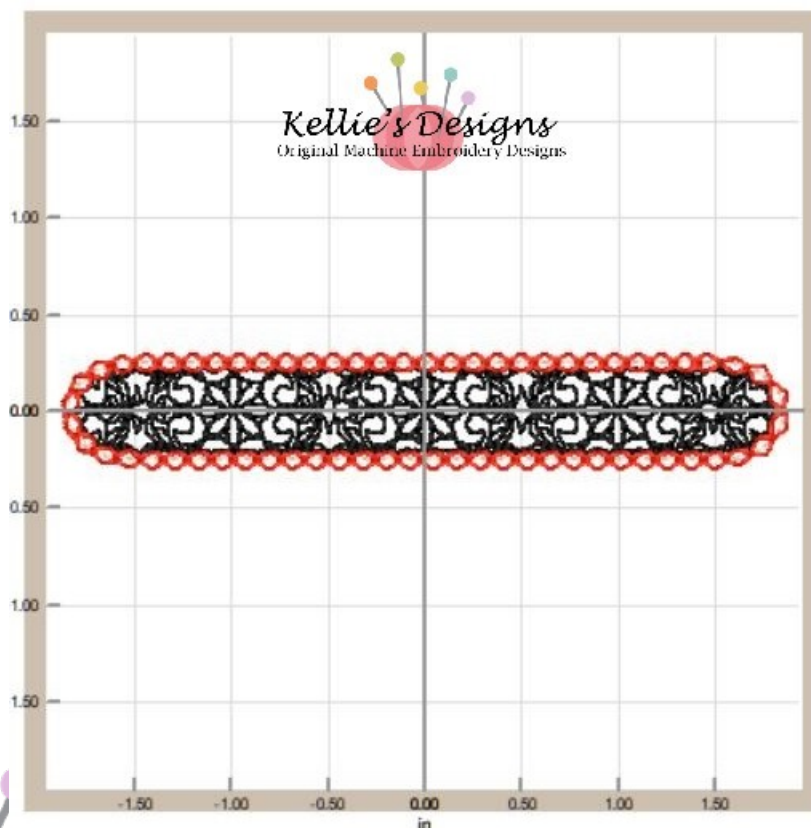

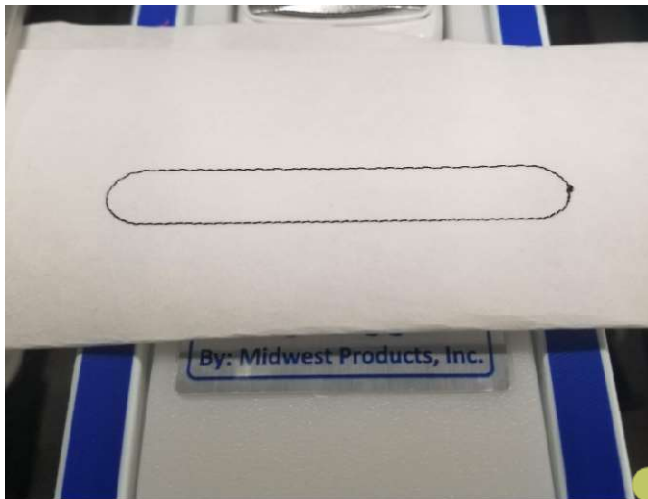


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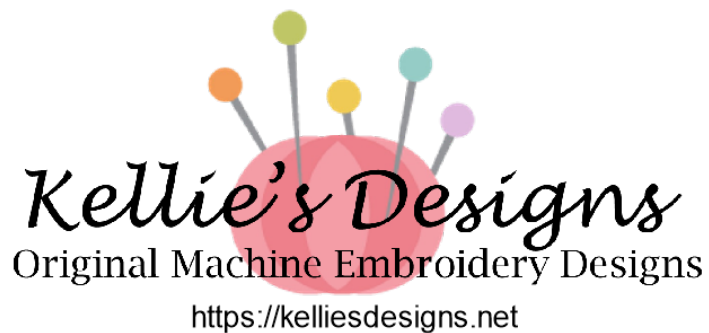
Color Change 1: Placement stitch
- stitch directly on stabilizer
and cover with vinyl.



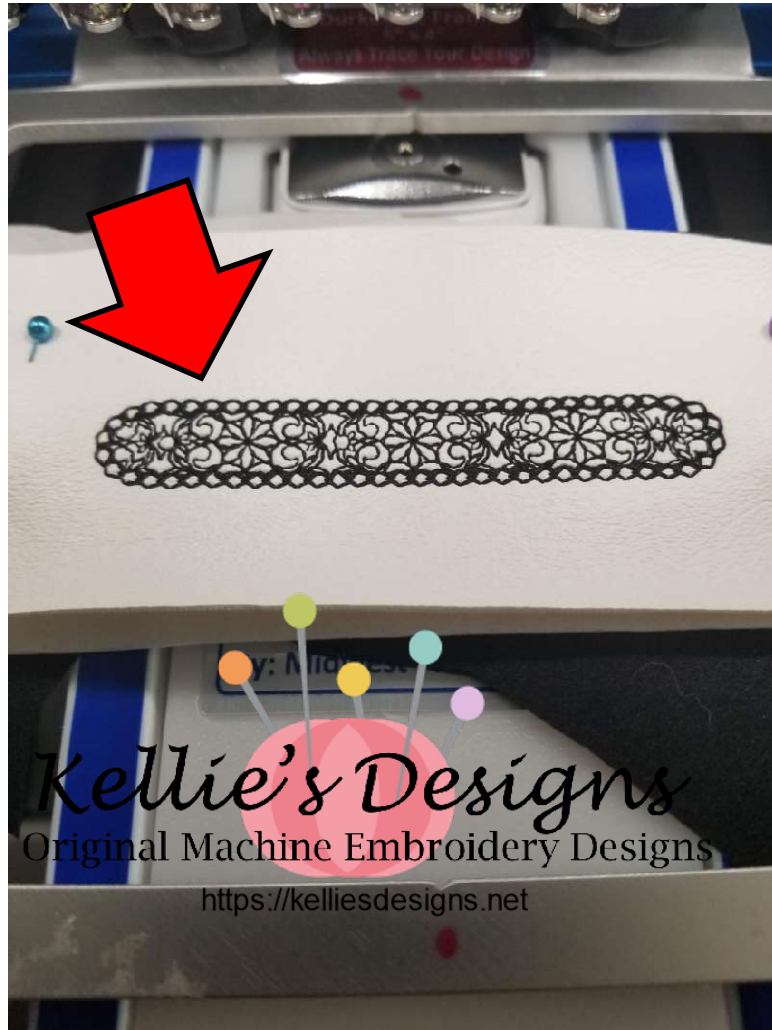
Cover stitches with vinyl and
secure in place with tape or pins.

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Color Change 2: -
Stitch design details



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Color Change 3: Place backing under hoop and run final bean stitch attaching front to back. Please choose something thin like oly fun for your backing because your going to be folding this design in 2 places - and you want to be sure you will have a rivet with a long enough post to do this.

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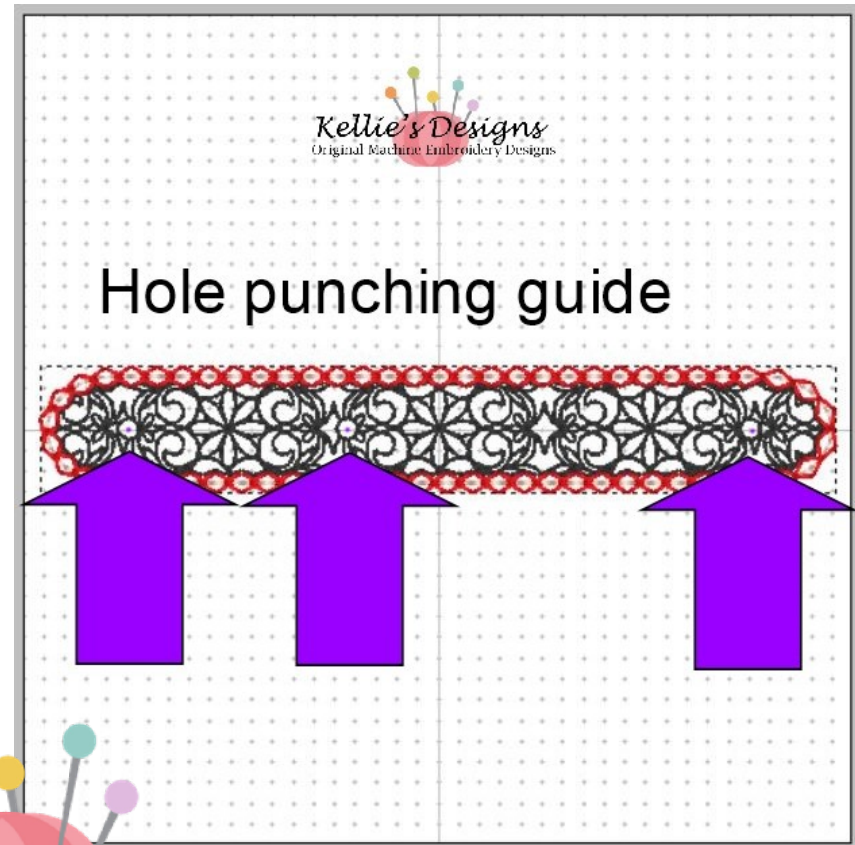
Once your stitching is complete, unhoop your project and carefully cut around the keychain.

Pro tip: I can't imagine life without my serrated scissors for cutting vinyl. I have 4 pairs of Kai scissors but these are my favorite for cutting vinyl!

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If you look closely at your embroidery you can see that I included 3 small holes (see picture for reference) within the design - these are your hole punch guides.



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Punch a small in the 3 indicated areas. (The red spots below)

I used a 4mm punch. If you don't have a punch - an awl would work but it would take several punches.

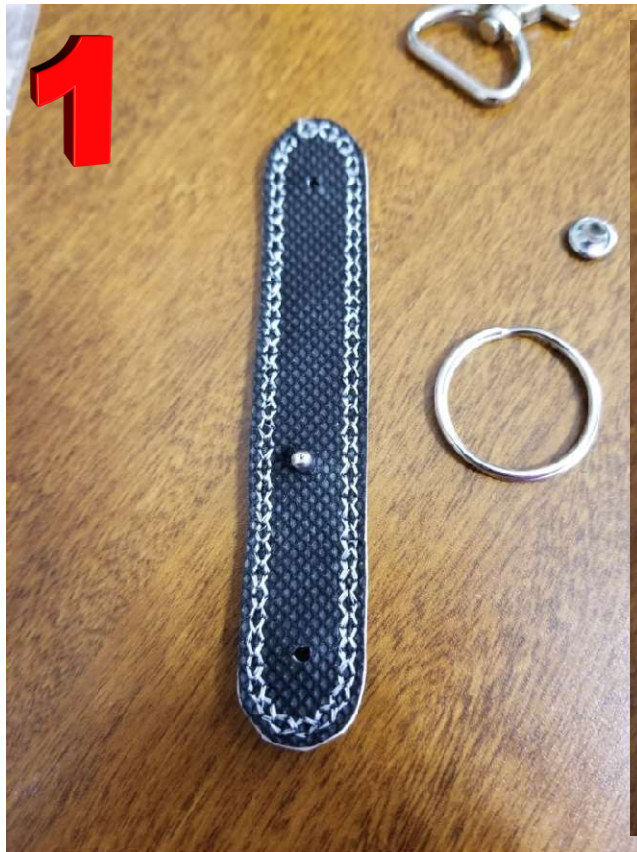


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Install your rivet as indicted below.
Put split ring in bottom fold and
lobster clasp in the top.

The backside of your keychain
should not be visible if folded
correctly.

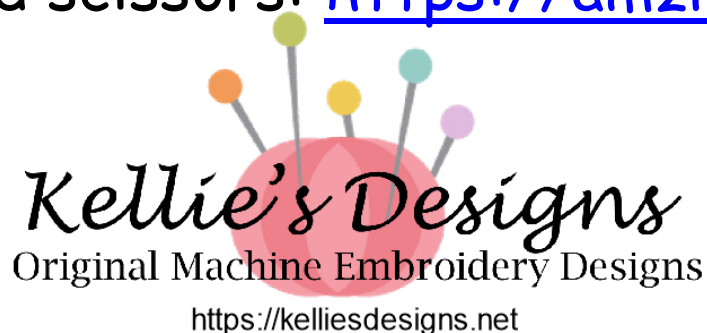
